About this report

Maria Regina Catholic Primary School (the 'School') is registered by the NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA) and managed by Catholic Schools Broken Bay (CSBB). CSBB as the 'approved authority' for the diocesan registration system formed under Section 39 of the NSW Education Act (1990), is responsible for monitoring the compliance of member schools in the manner that has been approved by the Minister of Education.



Managing Student Non-Attendance

In order for students to reach their full potential it is of paramount importance that they attend school regularly. While it is the parents' legal responsibility under the NSW Education Act (1990) to ensure that their children attend school regularly, our staff as part of their duty of care,

Summary of professional learning at this school

The School's Religious Education (RE) program is based on the Broken Bay K-12 Religious Education Curriculum and aims to provide

Teaching staff had opportunities to participate in Professional Learning to upgrade their knowledge about teaching Religious Education. A new Religious Education Syllabus is being implemented in Stage 3. The new syllabus is underpinned by the three Broken Bay foundation principles: accompaniment, encounter and transformation. Staff participated in a faith formation day with a visit to St Mary's Cathedral and NSW Art gallery where they meditated on religious artworks and celebrated mass together.

Curriculum, Learning and Teaching

The School provides an educational program based on, and taught in accordance with the NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA) syllabuses for primary education. The Key Learning Areas (KLAs) are English, Mathematics, Science and Technology (S&T), Human Society and its Environment (HSIE), Creative Arts (CA) and Personal Development, Health and Physical Education (PDHPE). In addition to this, the School implements the Diocesan Religious Education syllabus. Staff members are committed to continuous improvement of teaching and learning in all facets of the curriculum.

All staff are committed to a collaborative culture of Continuous Improvement and a relentless focus on student achievement. This has been evident by staff participation in Collaborative Coaching, a CSBB initiative. Staff worked collaboratively to use evidence to inform decisions, set goals for students

NAPLAN


Students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 across Australia participated in the National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN). The purpose of NAPLAN is to provide information to parents and teachers about the achievements of students in literacy and numeracy. The test provides a measure of the student's performance against established standards and against other students in Australia. 
